Blessed are You, *Adonai* our God, Sovereign of the Universe, who performed miracles for our ancestors in those days in this time.

Baruch atah Adonai Eloheinu Melech haolam shehecheyanu v'kiy'manu v'higianu laz'eman hazeh.

Blessed are You, *Adonai* our God, Sovereign of the Universe, granting us life, sustaining us, and enabling us to reach this time.

First light the Shamash, then kindle the remaining candles from left to right.

Facing the Hanukkah menorah, place candles in their holders from right to left.
